Municipal Liaison Committee Meeting	12/02/2026	The MLC meeting focused on several standing agenda items. New topics included sewage management on houseboats and a discussion on commercial licensing. The LBRCT committed to drafting stricter agreements for commercial operators. Additionally, slipway monitoring of the Witsand public launch sites was raised with the LBRCT reminding the Municipalities of all prerequisites before any commitments are made.

Hessequa Municipality Review of Draft Tariffs and Bylaw Related Policies	20/01/2026	This meeting provided an opportunity to give inputs and objections to Municipal tariffs and bylaws; however, only draft tariffs and policies were communicated. These largely covered municipal grants, utilities, services, and other tariffs not related to the LBRCT.
Consultation with E Jorge Attorneys	30/01/2026	MS Teams meeting to further discuss the transgressions leading to the LBRCT opening a case against Mr X in respect of keeping an unlicensed vessel on the Breede Estuary.
Court Appearance	16/02/2026	Attendance of LBRCT at the Swellendam Magistrates court in relation to the fine issued to Mr X during December.
Turtle Rescue Network Road Trip	20/02/2026	The Two Oceans Aquarium boasts a growing Turtle Conservation Centre that requires Rescue Network Partners all along the South African coastline. The LBRCT is registered as the stranding network partner for the St Sebastian Bay. On the 20th of February, the Two Oceans team visited Witsand as part of their annual road trip aimed at informing the public of the need to conserve turtle populations and how to help stranded turtles.

Estuary Management Course	24/03/2026	The LBRCT manager, Jason Oxley, attended an accredited short learning programme on the

		Management of Estuaries in South Africa. The course was run by the Institute for Coastal and Marine Research of Nelson Mandela University and the Western Cape Government and hosted by the Overstrand Municipality. CSIR provided support in preparation of course material and contextualising a local case study, the Klein Estuarine Lake. The course took place from the 3rd to the 5th of March in Hermanus with 51 participants and 14 presenters attending. Other collaborators and presenters at the course were from the DWS, DFFE and CapeNature. The course was aimed at estuary RMA (Responsible Management Authority) officials as well as others interested and involved in the development of Estuary Management Plans and monitoring techniques. The three days included intense lecturing and discussions as well as an afternoon field trip.
